The board is open to participating next year if someone would be willing to take over the project management of the event. Malcolm and Karyn are willing to tell you all the details. And we can certainly get you good help!

2. Our spring Peter Stevenson storytelling workshop and performance was a big hit, as you probably know. Peter is from Aberwystwyth, Wales, and makes his living as a storyteller (yes, it is possible!). He had a wonderful time here in Seattle and wants to come back. Donations from the event helped our treasury and Peter. Thanks to Gwen Weinert and her family for allowing us to use their lovely house! We invited members of the Seattle Storytellers Guild and they are now interested in coordinating several other events with us. More about this later in my letter.

3. PSWA's Annual Picnic was a culinary and musical success, too. Nothing like a group of Welsh people singing their hearts out! Thanks to Laura Lovell and all for organizing. Thanks once again to Gwen and her family for the venue.



Near Future

1. The North American Festival of Wales, the big international festival held annually throughout North America and Canada, will be held this year in Milwaukee, Wisconsin from August 29 - September 1, 2019. Four days of film, dance, seminars, sing-alongs, concerts recitals and recitation—all centered around Wales. And our Mari Lwyd has been invited to be on stage at the opening concert. A number of you have met her at various events we've had. It is her international debut! We are sprucing her up, and figuring out how to get her there and back.

What fun it is for four days to immerse oneself in singing and storytelling and Welsh history and customs and politics. The pub sings are not to be missed. Think about coming—if not this year, then next. We have five members of our society that I know of that are attending this year. Let me know if you are going!

2. On October 5th 2019, PSWA is pleased to jointly produce an evening of Welsh Stories, Music and Poetry. We have formed a new partnership with the Seattle Storytellers Guild for this event - the first of its kind.



The first half of the evening will feature Jane Valencia and her program *When Harpers Once in Wooden Halls* with accompanying Celtic Harp. Jane's harp duo partner, Deb Knodel, will offer bardic storytelling and music. Their performances have been described as, "playful, intelligent, and pure magic."

The second half of the evening will feature our PSWA members. We are sending out an all call for entertainers, musicians, storytellers, dancers, harpists from our association. We are pleased to offer space in this event for our talented members to perform. Please call me at 206.525.5864 if you are interested. Deadline for application is September 22, 2019.

This event will be held at the Shoreline Unitarian Universalist Church, 14724 First Ave NE, Shoreline, WA. Admission: \$15/non-members of the Storytellers Guild or PSWA, \$10/Guild or PSWA members.

Susy Irwin, a fine teacher and spinner of tales from the Guild, will be offering a Saturday, October 5th Beginners Workshop, especially enabling PSWA members to work with any Welsh tales you may want to develop or learn to tell. The workshop will run from 1pm - 4pm held at the Haller Lake United Methodist

Church 13055 1st Ave NE Seattle in the Friendship Room on the First Floor (note this is a different venue than the evening performance). Admission: \$20/members of the Guild or PSWA and \$25/non-members of either group.

I have taken Suzy's quarter long class at North Seattle College, and can highly recommend her as a teacher and storytelling mentor. You can learn to tell a story in one session!

4. Stay tuned for our Christmas Party date, time and place to be announced. We had such a good time last year with the potluck, Mari Llwyd, wassail, hymn singing and general merriment. It is likely this year we will combine a short business meeting to elect new board members and officers. Don't worry; this part will be fun and short.

Far Future

The Storytellers Guild approached us several months ago with an idea for their spring epic festival. Each year they take a weekend and tell a national epic of substance and importance. This next year they propose to tell the *Mabinogion*, the lusty ancient Welsh epic.

The date of May 15, 2020 has been chosen. The event could be either a one or two day duration. No place has yet been decided.

Leadership from both societies are discussing how this might occur. Of course, experienced tellers such as Peter Stevenson may be contacted about coming, but the event is really open to local storytellers. The *Mabinogion* has many tales within the main tale, and the thought is that storytellers could identify a tale they wish to tell, study the tale and perform during the weekend. Both Storytellers Guild and Puget Sound Welsh Association members are invited to consider being a storyteller.

If you haven't picked up your copy of the *Mabinogion* already, grab it and give a look. Find a good story and envision yourself telling it! We will have lots of support for the telling, help with pronunciation, tips for picking a good story, assure continuity between stories, and work in interludes such as music, and small history forays. It will be another first for PSWA, a first for the Storytellers and certainly a first for the Seattle area!

There are many issues and questions to be worked through, and many details to be ironed out: i.e. there are different versions of the *Mabinogion*, some considered more authentic than others; there are stories which are self-explanatory and those which need some context setting; there are corollary tales, should they be included. So If you wish to be on the committee, which is now forming for the event, or would like to talk about being a storyteller, let me know at 206.525.5864. Start now.

SO MUCH! We are blessed by an abundance of Welsh richness and opportunities. Rydyn ni mor lwcus! (We are so lucky.)



Did You Know?

The *Mabinogion* is a collection of the earliest British prose stories compiled in the 12-13th centuries from even older oral traditions. Eleven separate prose stories of differing types from drama, philosophy, romance, tragedy, fantasy, and humor were created by various narrators over time. They are taken from two late-medieval manuscripts: the *Red Book of Hergest* and the *White Book of Rhydderch* and first translated by William Pughe and Lady Charlotte Guest in the early 19th century. The collection is a group of four medieval Welsh tales called the "Four Branches" with each ending with a version of the colophon, "Ac y uelly teruyna y geing hon yma Mabinogi" ("And thus ends this branch of the Mabinogi"). Not directly related to the four branches, included in the *Mabinogion* are four additional medieval tales and three romances.

Lady Charlotte Guest evidently used some discretionary editing and did not have access to the original manuscripts, but used other materials. Subsequent translations have been completed by Gwyn and Thomas Jones 1948 (and revised 1989), Jeffrey Gantz 1976, and Patrick Ford 1977. Welsh Onion Cake with Caerphilly

Prep: 30 mins Cook: 1-hr, 5mins Serves: 6

Kcal: 542 fat: 36g saturates: 22g carbs: 41g sugar: 9g fiber: 7g protein: 11g salt: 0.9g

*Add sharp, salty cheese and sweet leeks for a different taste!

Ingredients:

200g butter, plus extra for the tin (about 7.05 oz)

Drizzle of oil

3 large onions, thinly sliced

1 leek, sliced

1kg (about 2.2 pounds) floury potatoes, such as Maris Piper*, Russet, or Yukon Gold peeled and thinly sliced (use a mandoline or the fine slicing blade of a food processor)

150g (*about 1-1/4 cups or 5.3 oz*) Caerphilly cheese, crumbled (or another sharp, crumbly cheese)

*"Maris Piper is an oval, cream-colored potato with pale, golden skin. It has a texture described as fluffy or floury and is considered the best

variety for making french fries. It's also a favorite for mashing and baking, but it tends to fall apart when boiled, so is not a good choice for potato salad."

1. In a large pan, heat a knob of the butter with a drizzle of oil.

Once the butter is foaming, add the onions, leek and some seasoning and cook for 15 mins until the onions are soft and sticky, stirring occasionally. Butter a 23cm (9") cake tin or baking dish (or, assemble the cake in the pan you're already using if it's ovenproof).

2. In a separate pan, melt the remaining butter. Toss the sliced potatoes with the melted butter and plenty of seasoning. Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 (*electric/no fan: 400 F*; *electric w/fan: 156 F*).

3. Arrange the potato slices over the base of the dish in a spiral or in concentric circles. Top with some of the onion mix, sprinkle over a layer of cheese and continue layering, finishing with a final round of potato slices. Press down firmly with your hands to compact the layers. Bake for 45-50 mins until the potatoes are golden brown and tender; cover with foil if the cake starts to take on too much colour. Turn out onto a plate to serve.
